The Red Bull KTM Ajo Motorsport Team secure Moto2 Team World Championship for 2021!



After what has been an incredible season for the MotoBatt sponsored Moto2 team, Remy Gardner and Raul Fernandez completed the amazing achievement of securing the Moto2 Team World Championship at Round 13 of the Moto GP season, with 5 rounds to left to race.

It has been an incredible season which has seen the team achieve 463 points so far, with 9 victories and 9 podiums for the Moto2 riders. And the team couldn't have asked for a better result to take the title, with Gardner and Fernandez completing the Aragon GP with another one-two finish.

With the series heading to Silverstone for the British Grand Prix before moving to Spain and the iconic northern Spanish circuit of Aragon, the Red Bull KTM Ajo Team worked hard to continue with their spectacular form in both the Moto2 and Moto3 categories.



Moto2

Silverstone, Great Britain

Round 12

Round 12 of the 2021 MotoGP calendar saw the team head to the UK and once again taste success, with Remy Gardner taking a brilliant win at the British Grand Prix. This was the second consecutive round the Red Bull KTM Ajo Moto2 have been victorious, with the Australian claiming his fourth triumph of the year and the fifth of his career. Unfortunately, stunning rookie and teammate Raul Fernandez had a tough Sunday, with the Spaniard crashing out with four laps to go while riding in seventh position.

Remy Gardner gained a good start from the second row of the grid, holding onto fourth place. The Australian pushed hard to avoid an escape by those ahead of him and, on Lap 5, began to overtake his rivals and claim the lead. The Red Bull KTM Ajo Moto2 star tried to escape, with only one rider following him. In a duel for the victory, Gardner eventually won out.

The British Grand Prix race started well for Fernandez, who was on the second row of the grid. Getting off the line well, he was fifth into the first corner, then latched onto the leading group, but shortly thereafter he dropped a place. With four laps remaining, Fernandez was unable to avoid a crash at Turn 13 when up into 7th and could not re-join the contest.

Gardner left the UK leading the Moto2 World Championship with 231 points, with Fernandez 2nd with 187.

MotorLand Aragón, Spain

Round 13

The Red Bull KTM Ajo Moto2 team enjoyed a dream weekend at the Aragon Grand Prix, as they were crowned Team World Champions in the Moto2 class. They did so with a fifth one-two finish of the season, thanks to race winner Raul Fernandez and second placed Remy Gardner. The team has achieved 9 victories and 9 podiums this season so far.

The Aragon Grand Prix began well for Fernandez, who managed to maintain the third position on the grid. From the start of the contest, the Spaniard proved to be one step ahead of his rivals, and on Lap 4 he hunted down

the leader and passed him to take the lead. From that moment on, the Red Bull KTM Ajo Moto2 rider pushed to break away from the rest of the field, going on to claim the fifth win of his rookie season. The result – the 7th victory of his Grand Prix career to date – comes just a week after having undergone surgery on a fractured fifth right metacarpal.

Gardner started from second and pushed hard, although on Lap 2 he was overtaken by his teammate and was left isolated in third place. Staying focused and calm,

and enduring the heat on track, he would move back up a position when the rider in second crashed in the final third of the contest. The Spaniard stayed in that spot until the chequered flag, completing the one-two finish and taking his 6th podium of 2021 so far.

Gardner continues to lead the World Championship with 251 points, with Fernandez second with 212. Red Bull KTM Ajo will be back to work in less than a week for the San Marino Grand Prix, held from September 17-19th.

Moto3

Silverstone, Great Britain

Round 12

After two years away, Silverstone once again hosted a Moto3 World Championship, with the Red Bull KTM Ajo team attempting a race day fightback. Jaume Masia was competitive and was involved in a battle for the podium, eventually placing sixth at the British Grand Prix. Pedro Acosta climbed 11 places to conclude the 12th round of the 2021 season in 11th position.

Masia, who took off from the fourth row of the grid, progressively climbed up the order during the early stages, joining a large group competing for third place.

The Red Bull KTM Ajo Moto3 rider was able to stay focused and calm despite some frantic overtakes around him. However, the pack broke up before the end and he would come home in sixth position.

Acosta managed to fight back after a tough qualifying on Saturday and, despite starting from the eighth row of the grid, managed to climb 11 places in just three laps. With the leaders having already broken away, the rookie remained in the group fighting for the Top 10. Pushing hard to fend off constant overtaking attempts, particularly on the final laps, he would cross the finish line 11th at his first race at Silverstone.

Acosta left Silverstone remaining the series leader with 201 points, whilst Masia is 5th with 105.





MotorLand Aragón, Spain

Round 13

The Red Bull KTM Ajo Moto3 experienced a difficult Sunday at the Aragon Grand Prix. Jaume Masia achieved tenth place, despite suffering a crash in the warm-up that forced the team to undertake rapid repair work on his bike. Pedro Acosta crashed out with four laps remaining, when part of the leading group in five position.

Acosta, who began from the third row of the grid, once again made a good start, going from ninth to sixth on the opening lap. The Spaniard joined up with a large group of riders, and ascended to second place by Lap 4, followed

by constant overtaking around him. Unfortunately, four laps before the chequered flag and riding in fifth, he fell at Turn 5 and was unable to re-join the race.

The Aragon Grand Prix began well for Masia, who got off the line strongly and subsequently latched onto the large chasing pack trying to close down the leaders. Pushing hard throughout, with various tussles for positions and several incidents for the rivals ahead of him, he eventually crossed the line in tenth place.

Acosta remains the leader of the Moto3 World Championship with 201 points. Masia is 5th with 111. Red Bull KTM Ajo will be in action again next weekend at the San Marino GP, from September 17th-19th.
